Spotlight: Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten Registration

The January Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten school choice lottery for students who are eligible for either JK or K begins on Tuesday, January 2nd, 2018 and ends on Wednesday, January 31, 2018.

All registration forms for the lottery must be submitted in person to the Family Resource Center (Cambridge Rindge & Latin School, First Floor, FRC Entrance, 459 Broadway St.).

Important information to keep in mind: Children born between September 1, 2013 – March 31, 2014 should register for **Junior Kindergarten** between January 2nd and January 31st. Children born between September 1, 2012 – August 31, 2013 should register for **Kindergarten** between January 2nd and January 31st.

How to register:

- 1. Complete the registration forms. Email welcome@cpsd.us to request the digital forms, download the application at www.cpsd.us, or pick up a packet at the Family Resource Center (FRC).
- 2. Gather your required documents (see below). The checklist on the front of the application can help you organize your paperwork.
- 3. Go to the Family Resource Center between 1/2/18 and 1/31/18 to turn in your forms! **January 31st is the deadline to participate in the First Cycle Kindergarten Lottery.** This is the time when you will have the best chance of getting one of your school choices.






